All information, new updates, and guidelines will be available in September. The candidate selection should be made by April 1. After the packet is completed, it must be sent to Dr. Tonja Tift, Vice President of GAVESNP/GACTE by April 1 to check qualifications of the candidate and ultimately to Misty Freeman, GACTE Awards Committee Chairperson, by May 1.

It is important to start the nominating process for your candidate as soon as possible so there is plenty of time for drafts, proof, and remembering all the things that the teacher has done in the current year. The letters and other supporting documents take some time to complete with accuracy and effort.
