### Emerging Leaders Days

Emerging Leaders Conference (ELC) is held in the early fall at the Georgia FFA-FCCLA Center in Covington, GA. This one-day event helps students develop essential employability skills like teamwork and cooperation through structured, hands-on activities that encourage both individual growth and collaborative success.

#### Fall Rally

Georgia CTI's Fall Rally brings students together for a day of motivation and career exploration at the Georgia National Fair. The event features an inspiring rally, handson exhibits, and industry insights, encouraging students to explore new career paths and expand their future possibilities.

### **National Fair Youth Competitions**

The Georgia National Fair Youth Competition showcases Georgia CTI students' creative through T-shirt, pin, and banner design contests, plus themed speeches. Held each October in Perry, GA, this event celebrates student achievements and highlights the skills and core values of the CTI program.

### Fall Leadership Conference

The Fall Leadership Conference (FLC), is a two-day event focused on leadership, career readiness, and employability skills. Students attend workshops, industry tours, a college fair, and competitions. A keynote speaker, student-led sessions, and a formal dinner reinforce self-advocacy and professionalism, preparing them for success beyond high school.

#### CTSO Legislative Day

CTSO Legislative Day gives students the chance to visit the Georgia Capitol, meet legislators, and see government in action. They advocate for CTAE and CTSOs while learning how policy impacts their education and careers. This event emphasizes student leadership, workforce development, and career readiness in Georgia.

#### State Leadership Conference

The State Leadership Conference (SLC) is a two-night event where students compete in 40+ career-focused events, build career portfolios, and network with industry leaders. Featuring leadership sessions and state officer elections, SLC prepares students for life after high school while celebrating their hard work and achievements throughout the year.
